

Book Group Discussion Questions

Need a place to start for your next book group meeting? Here are a few questions for any book to get your readers thinking and opening some good discussions.

- 1. What was your favorite part of this book, and why did you like it?
- 2. What was your least favorite part of this book, and why did it bother you?
- 3. Would you want to read another book by this author? Why or why not?
- 4. Who do you think would most enjoy reading this book?
- 5. Share a favorite quote from the book. Why did this passage stand out to you?
- 6. What feelings did this book bring for you?
- 7. If you could ask the author anything, what would it be?
- 8. What do you think the author's purpose was in writing this book?
- 9. Did you find the author's style easy or difficult to read? Why?
- 10. How did this book impact you? Will you remember it in a few years? Would you ever want to re-read it?

Fiction

- 1. How did the setting contribute to the mood or tension of the story? Would it have been the same if it had been set somewhere else?
- 2. Did the characters seem believable to you? Why or why not?
- 3. Do you have a favorite character from this book? If so, which character and why?
- 4. What do you think were the central themes of the book?
- 5. Did the book unfold in the way that you expected it to? What surprised you? What was predictable?

Nonfiction

- 1. What new things did you learn from this book?
- 2. What else have you read on this topic? Would you recommend any similar books to others?
- 3. Did this book make you want to explore the topic further?
- 4. What do you think about the author's sources and research?
- 5. Did you agree with the author's conclusions? Why or why not?
