What will you make?

Beginning with the purchase of our first printer and filament in 2015, the Bedford Public Library has been proud to offer 3D printing services through the generous support of the Bedford Library Foundation and the Friends of the Bedford Public Library.



Quick Facts

- Our printer is compatible with .stl and .3mf files.
- We print with PLA plastic derived from renewable resources.
- The cost to print is \$.20 per gram with a minimum cost of \$5, due with the print request form.
- Our printer's maximum print dimensions are 10" X 10" x10".
- Printed objects must require less than 10 hours to print.
- A library card is not required to use the 3D printer.

3D Printing at the Bedford Public Library

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How Do I Print?

1

Design your own object using TinkerCAD or other CAD software or visit a website like Thingiverse, Printables, or MakerWorld to find a design you'd like to try.

2

Choose your color. See the 3D Print Request for the current full list of filament colors.

3

Download a 3D Printing Form at bedfordnhlibrary.org/3d-printing and email the completed form and your project's URL or file to reference@bedfordnh.org. A completed form is required for each print request.

4

Stop by the Reference Desk to pay your \$5 deposit via cash or check. (You can also drop off a print version of your request form.)

We'll be in touch if there are any questions or if your project's weight estimate comes to more than 25g. Otherwise, we'll email you when your printed project is ready to pick up!

The Fine Print: Library Printing Policy

1. The Library's 3D printer may be used for lawful purposes only. The public will not be permitted to use the Library's 3D printer to create material that is: a. Prohibited by state, local, or federal law. b. Obscene. c. In violation of another's intellectual property rights. For example, the printer will not be used to reproduce a material that is subject to copyright, patent or trademark protection.
2. The Library reserves the right to review all files before printing and to refuse 3D printing requests which are too large to fit within the printer's build space or to print within 10 hours, or are formatted in a way that prevents successful completion of the print or may cause harm to the equipment.
3. Cost: The cost of printing is \$0.20 per gram, with a minimum charge of \$5.00, due when the request is submitted. The Library Staff reserves the right to change the cost as needed. Patrons will be charged for the weight at printing time including any rafts or supports required for successful printing.
4. 3D printing staff will notify the patron if their object will cost more than \$5.00 to print.
5. The patron will be responsible for the full price of the full weight of a successful print, including any rafts or supports deemed necessary for a successful print.
6. Print-on-Demand objects must require less than 10 hours to print each piece. Multi-piece requests will be considered on a case-by-case basis, and if other requests come in, the multiple pieces may be printed alternately with other requests.
7. Only designated Library Staff and volunteers will have hands-on access to the 3D printer.
8. Schedule and access to the 3D printer will be determined by Library staff.
9. A library card is not required to print; however, priority in scheduling may be given to Bedford cardholders.
10. The Bedford Library maintains no ownership of the printed item once printing is complete, nor is it responsible for any printed item, or the use of that item by any individual.
11. The 3D printing of an item is not an endorsement of the philosophy, viewpoint, opinion, or objectives of the patron or item being printed.
12. The 3D printing of an item is not and shall not constitute knowledge or awareness of any unapparent final use of the 3D printed item by any individual and the Town of Bedford, NH and its officials, agents, employees and volunteers specifically disclaims any knowledge or awareness thereof.
13. Completed items that are printed will be kept for 14 calendar days for pick up. The Library reserves the right to discard the item after that time, absent extenuating circumstances.
